As we move towards the Easter Break and the final term of the Leaving Certificate cycle for your son or daughter, we would like to bring to your attention the following information.

Oral Language & Music Practical Examinations

The oral examination component for Irish, Modern Foreign Languages and the Music Practical Examinations will take place from the 9th-14th April (both dates inclusive)

• Irish	9 th – 14 th April	40% (HL & OL)
• Spanish	11 th & 12 th April	25% (HL) 20% (OL)
• French	13 th April	25% (HL) 20% (OL)
• German	9 th April	25% (HL) 20% (OL)
• Polish	14 th April	30% (HL) 25% (OL)
• Russian	13 th April	30% (HL) 25% (OL)
• Music	12 th April	50% (HL & OL)

While it has been a stressful time for all students emerging from Covid and facing the realities of sitting an examination in June, it is vitally important that students make a determined effort with these examinations. Every effort has been made to ensure that students sit only one examination per day. As ever when these examinations were held in school the following is expected:

- **Students required to be present thirty minutes in advance of their allocated time. This has already been emailed to students and added to their Year Group Team.**
- **Students must present in full uniform (no tracksuit)**
- **Students should know their examination number**

If a student misses an examination component due to being too sick to attend, or due to Covid 19, a medical certificate is required in order to avail of an opportunity to re-sit at a later date in May.

We have stated clearly to all students that the full school uniform must be worn to each day. Please note that students who have opted to take PE as an examination subject will wear the regular uniform to school and change in school before and after each PE class.

Mobile Phones

At a recent presentation made to 5th and 6th year students by Richard Horgan he observed that while students may be studying, any disruption, such as a text message, can mean students taking 25 minutes to get back to the level of study they were at. Students at this stage need to now begin a positive relationship in terms of their phone usage and restrict their engagement when studying.

Sixth Year Graduation

We look forward once again to having our face-to-face Graduation Ceremony for the first time since 2019. This will take place on Monday 28th May and will allow us all to celebrate your son's and daughter's journey with us here in the Coláiste.
